Assurances

- The Academy will administer an approved benchmark assessment, or local benchmark assessment, or any combination thereof, to all pupils in grades K to 8 to measure proficiency in mathematics and to pupils in grades K to 8 to measure proficiency in reading within the first nine weeks of the 2022-2023 school year and again by the end of the academic year
- The Academy will report results from the benchmark assessment to parents and/or legal guardians within 30 days of testing
- If the Academy chooses to utilize a local assessment, they must report to the MDE the local assessment used, how that assessment measures change, including any losses as well as the district's plan for addressing learning loss. *LSSU recommends utilizing NWEA which aligns with your existing Educational Goals
- Within 30 days of testing, the Academy must provide to the MDE data from the local assessment aggregated by grade level, student demographic subgroups, and mode of instruction. If available, this must include information on student growth from fall 21 to fall 22.
- The Academy may apply for funding for the benchmark assessment (12.50 per students)
- The Academy will create and make available on its transparency reporting link located on the Academy's website, a report concerning the progress made in meeting the educational goals contained in its Learning Plan not later than February 2023, for goals its expected would be achieved by the middle of the school year and not later than the last day of school of the 2022-2023 school year for goals the Academy expected would be achieved by the end of the school year.
- By the first board meeting in February 2023 and again by the end of the school year, the superintendent or chief administrator must present the results of the benchmark assessment as well as progress towards goals at a public board meeting. Data should be disaggregated by grade level, student demographics, and mode of instruction
- Educational goals must be established no later than September 15, 2022 (including mid-year and end of year goals)
*Section 98b (d) (iv) states, "For districts that provided extended COVID Learning Plans under section 98a, the goals must correlate to the educational goals that were included in the district's COVID-19 Learning Plan for the 2020-21 and 2021-22 school year."
